

C amping Memberships with exclusive use, possession and control of a specific campsite are now available. There are sites which are established while others remain in their natural state. You choose the one that best suits your needs and the site you choose may be developed within the guidelines of the Association's by-laws. There is also a "one time transfer" if you should change your mind at a later date.

Each Member is entitled to one vote per Membership.

The facilities are mainly centrally located and there are no restrictions of use of the facilities, such as operation and use fees. Responsibility for repair and maintenance is held by the Association.

The campground assets are available to all Members and their guests however, no person other than his or her immediate family or authorized person may use the campsite. An onsite Caretaker assures that your investment is secure and there is a friendly face to greet you upon arrival.

In addition to our own Buck Lake, our 42 acre campground is across the road from **Phillips Lake**. **Spencer Lake** and **Harstine Island** are also nearby providing additional public recreation and the **Olympic Mountains** and **Ocean Beaches** are just a few hours drive away.

Buck Lake is located in Mason County which exists of several rural communities such as Belfair, Allyn, Hoodsport, Union, Tahuya, Lilliwaup, Grapeview, Matlock and Elma, to name a few. The town of Shelton is Mason County's only incorporated city.

Mason County is located on the southwestern end of Hood

Canal and Puget Sound and extends into the Olympic

National Forest and the Olympic National Park. The Olympic National Forest is home to the Olympic Mountain range which can been seen throughout Mason County. US Highway 101 travels north and south along Puget Sound and Hood Canal.

Highway 101 easily connects to **Interstate 5** making the entire I-5 corridor easily accessible.

Shelton, is approximately 85 miles southwest of **Seattle**, and is approximately 65 miles southwest of **Sea-Tac International Airport**. **Olympia** is only 20 miles southeast of Shelton, and **Bremerton** is 36 miles northeast. **Portland** sits 130 miles south on the I-5 corridor.

Next to Highway 101 in Shelton, you'll find several major stores, restaurants, and local businesses. There you'll also find **Mason General Hospital,** a complete medical center with over 100 physicians on staff and 24-hour emergency care, which is located at **901 Mountain View Drive**.

Buck Lake Campgrounds is located just 8 miles north of Shelton off Highway 3 at **641 E. Phillips**

To get to **Buck Lake** take **Highway 3** to **Pickering**

Road. Turn onto Pickering Road and head towards Harstine Island/ Jarrell's Cove for 1.2 miles to E. Phillips Lake Road. Turn right onto E. Phillips Lake Road for .9 mile to E. Phillips Lake Loop Road. Turn left onto E. Phillips Lake Loop Road and continue for approximately 1/4 of a mile.
